As part of the Bocholt liest! event series, the author will be presenting the latest case of detective Theo Krumme and his partner Pat, in which the duo reach their physical and mental limits. Anyone interested now has the opportunity to meet the author live and embark together on a captivating journey to the North Sea coast.

Hendrik Berg, born in Hamburg in 1964, puts a lot of his homeland into his novels. They are not only set on the North Sea coast, but also take in the landscape, secrets and legends of the region. Coupled with a straightforward, clear writing style, plenty of local colour and some North Sea originals, he creates exciting crime novels with a North Sea feel and believable characters.

"Hendrik Berg's crime novels always put a little salt in my nose", enthuses Klaudia Kroesen from the city library. "It's a bit like a holiday trip where you join in the puzzles with the team of investigators and come across a few surprises. This is also the case in the latest volume of the series centred around Theo Krumme and I am particularly looking forward to a North Frisian evening."
