With a Women's Financial Fair, the Catholic Women's Association of Germany in the Diocese of Münster (kfd) invites all those interested to look into their own financial independence on Saturday 17 June. The event is aimed at women who are interested in their financial independence and want to take their finances into their own hands.

A wide range of workshops, lectures and exhibition stands on various topics related to financial planning and retirement provisions will give participants the opportunity to exchange ideas with experts from the financial sector - such as Anne Connelly from hermoney.de or Helma Sick, columnist for financial topics - and to get tips for their individual financial planning. Aspects such as ethical-sustainable investments or the compatibility of family and career are also taken into account.

The kfd is committed to the empowerment of women and their financial independence," says Reinhilde Riesenbeck, deputy chairperson of the kfd Münster. "The fair is an important step to support women in shaping their financial future."
