The EASA (European Union Aviation Safety Agency) has its headquarters in the former railway headquarters on Konrad-Adenauer-Ufer. Experts from almost all European countries are constantly working to ensure that flying over Europe is safe. For example, the Bocholt group learned which tests have to be carried out before an aircraft can be certified and take to the air.
