"Handclap" on the occasion of the 40th anniversary of the German-British Society Bocholt

Numerous guests and members celebrate in the Mussum Heimathaus

After the rhythmic drum sounds of the group "La Banda Furiosa", the chairman of the German-British Society Bocholt, Andreas Becker, welcomed the numerous members and guests at the Heimathaus Mussum. Under the motto "Today we bang the drums", the society celebrated its 40th anniversary there at the weekend.

The German-British Society Bocholt was founded in 1983. Until today, it has been an integral part of urban life in Bocholt with numerous events and a lively club life. At the same time, the society has been twinned with Rossendale for many decades. The English twin town in the Lancashire district is home to its partner association.
